The MiT program seeks a creative, collaborative administrator/educator to serve as the **Director for Teacher Education Programs**. The Director is responsible for the Master in Teaching Program (MiT) and other programs that may be developed. The ideal candidate will be a collaborative leader who thoughtfully and intellectually engages with faculty, staff, the College and the larger MiT community in developing and sustaining a vision for the program. We are particularly interested in someone who will think with us about how to best serve those with the most at stake in public education: families and communities. We employ an interdisciplinary perspective that creates an integrated, inquiry-based approach to teacher development. We carefully explore how theory and practice effectively support teacher development and student learning.

The Master in Teaching degree program is transitioning to a model in which candidates earn their Washington State teacher certification in four quarters and receive support through an induction program that culminates in a Masters degree. Upcoming revisions to our MiT program will provide the MiT team with opportunities to collaborate on curricular revisions that enhance access as well as the diversity of our educator workforce, and that reinforce community networks.

Additionally, we seek a full-time **faculty member to teach in our Master in Teaching program**, with expertise in K-12 teacher preparation and specific expertise in teaching children in K-12 educational and/or community-based settings. The person selected for this position must demonstrate: a professional and critical understanding of teacher education; experience and ability to work collaboratively and across disciplines; use of culturally responsive teaching in teacher education and K-12 educational settings. The successful applicant will teach regularly with an interdisciplinary faculty team and work in close collaboration with both MiT staff and faculty. This candidate will be proactive and skilled in building and sustaining mutually beneficial and respectful partnerships with local families and communities, K-12 district partners, and educators. Upcoming revisions to our MiT program will provide the MiT team with opportunities to participate in curricular revisions to enhance access and diversity of our educator workforce, and to reinforce community networks.
