Job Summary

Central Washington University's EDTL Department seeks a highly prepared, engaging, and passionate constructivist teacher educator to join our teaching faculty in Elementary Education (K-8) Programs. The ideal candidates will have evidence of classroom experience with diverse learners, as well as strong communication, interpersonal and technological skills.

The Assistant/Associate Professor selected for this position will be a key partner in our revised Elementary Education major program. This individual will teach a variety of courses, such as ELEM 323 Learners in the Learning Environment; ELEM 325 Integrating the Arts (This is a course on integrating arts content across the elementary core curriculum and arts appreciation course. It is not an arts methods course.); and EDEL 423 Integrated Methods/ Elementary Education Capstone. This individual will also have opportunities to coach and mentor teacher candidates in a variety of field experience courses.

Minimum Qualifications

- Earned doctorate in Elementary Education, Curriculum and Instruction specializing in elementary education or a closely-related field. Doctoral degree must be completed no later than September 16, 2019.
- Minimum of three years of certificated public school elementary education teaching experience in the United States.
- Eligible for Washington State Teaching Certification or hold a valid teaching certificate.
- Demonstrated commitment to the Constructivist teaching philosophy and methodology.
- Demonstrated commitment to diversity. Must demonstrate a commitment to the diversity of a multi-cultural population, as well as work effectively in a team-based environment, seeking continuous improvement and adherence to the university philosophy.
- Strong communication, interpersonal and technological skills.

- Expertise in curriculum development and content integration.
- Degree or licensure in teaching the arts at elementary levels.
- Evidence of demonstrated excellence in teaching at K-8.
